Proteas are unlike any other plant—bold, sculptural and impossible to overlook. With their vibrant blooms and stunning, leathery foliage, they bring the wild into the garden.

Thriving in full sun and well-drained, acidic soils, these hardy shrubs are built to survive dry conditions while delivering a trademark floral display.

They love sandy or gravelly soils, but will also do well in clay, needing little to no additional fertiliser, as they are adapted to nutrient-poor soils.

Once established, they require minimal watering, making them an excellent choice for low-maintenance gardens. Pruning after flowering keeps plants compact and encourages new growth, ensuring an even better display the following season.

Proteas offer remarkable versatility in the landscape. Use them as eyecatching feature plants, mix them into a native or dry-climate garden, or plant in clusters for a dramatic, naturalistic effect.

Smaller varieties are well-suited to pots, bringing their unique charm to patios and balconies.

Their nectar-rich flowers attract birds and pollinators, adding movement and life to the garden.

They vary in shape, size and colour—from ground-hugging forms, small to medium shrubs and even trees.



Waratahs love the sun but will also grow happily in a partly shaded position, especially in hotter climates where some afternoon shade can prevent stress.

They prefer a little shelter from strong winds but, once established, are surprisingly tough, handling dry spells with ease.

Their dramatic flowers aren't just for show—bees, birds and pollinators flock to them, bringing life and movement to your garden.

While waratahs are iconic for their deep red blooms, they also come in shades of pink, creamy white and vibrant yellow and crimson, adding even more variety to the garden.

Their strong, woody stems make

them excellent for cut flowers, with blooms lasting for weeks in a vase.

Regular pruning after flowering helps maintain a compact shape and encourages even more prolific flowering in the seasons to come.

Given the right conditions, a waratah can become the centrepiece of any landscape. Whether grown as a feature shrub, part of a mixed native garden, or in a large pot, its spectacular floral display is well worth the wait.
