Wild, dramatic with blooms that are impossible to ignore.

Proteas are unlike any other plant—bold, sculptural and impossible to overlook. With their vibrant blooms and stunning, leathery foliage, they bring the wild into the garden.

Thriving in full sun and well-drained, acidic soils, these hardy shrubs are built to survive dry conditions while delivering a trademark floral display.

They love sandy or gravelly soils, but will also do well in clay, needing little to no additional fertiliser, as they are adapted to nutrient-poor soils.

Once established, they require minimal watering, making them an excellent choice for low-maintenance gardens. Pruning after flowering keeps plants compact and encourages new growth, ensuring an even better display the following season.

Proteas offer remarkable versatility in the landscape. Use them as eye-catching feature plants, mix them into a native or dry-climate garden, or plant in clusters for a dramatic, naturalistic effect.

Smaller varieties are well-suited to pots, bringing their unique charm to patios and balconies.

Their nectar-rich flowers attract birds and pollinators, adding movement and life to the garden.

They vary in shape, size and colour—from ground-hugging forms, small to medium shrubs and even trees.

Every garden deserves a protea.

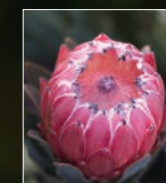

Leucospermum are a vibrant, architectural beauty that bring a bold splash of colour to the garden.

Also known as pincushions, their striking, spiky blooms in fiery shades of red, orange and yellow, create dramatic focal points while also attracting bees, butterflies and nectar-loving birds.

These tough yet elegant plants thrive in well-drained soils, making them ideal for low-maintenance, water-wise gardens.

Once established, they are remarkably drought-tolerant, needing only occasional deep watering in extended dry spells.

Their naturally rounded form makes them perfect for mass plantings, borders, or as a feature shrub in a native or Mediterranean-style garden.

Leucospermums don't just put on a seasonal show—their long-lasting flowers are a florist's favourite, holding their shape and colour for weeks in arrangements.

Regular pruning after flowering encourages compact growth and an even more spectacular display the following year.

Resilient, eye-catching and easy to grow, leucospermum is a must-have for those looking to add both structure and colour to their garden.

Whether planted in the ground or kept in a large pot, these striking shrubs will continue to impress year after year.

Waratah are showstoppers—bold, sculptural and undeniably Australian.

With their brilliant flowers and dark green foliage, they command attention in the garden.

These striking natives thrive in well-drained, acidic soil and reward patient growers with breathtaking blooms in Spring.

Waratahs love the sun but will also grow happily in a partly shaded position, especially in hotter climates where some afternoon shade can prevent stress.

They prefer a little shelter from strong winds but, once established, are surprisingly tough, handling dry spells with ease.

Their dramatic flowers aren't just for show—bees, birds and pollinators flock to them, bringing life and movement to your garden.

While waratahs are iconic for their deep red blooms, they also come in shades of pink, creamy white and vibrant yellow and crimson, adding even more variety to the garden.

Their strong, woody stems make

them excellent for cut flowers, with blooms lasting for weeks in a vase.

Regular pruning after flowering helps maintain a compact shape and encourages even more prolific flowering in the seasons to come.

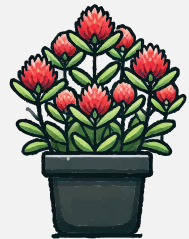

Leucadendron are the real quiet achievers of the garden—architectural, hardy and striking.

While they don't produce the large showy flowers of their protea relatives, their vivid bracts and ever-changing foliage bring year-round colour and structure.

With shades that shift through the seasons—deep greens, silvers, fiery reds and golds—these tough yet elegant plants add depth and contrast to the landscape.

Thriving in full sun and well-drained soil, leucadendron are remarkably low-maintenance.

They're built to withstand dry conditions, making them perfect for water-wise gardens, exposed coastal areas and even large pots.

They prefer an open, sunny position, but will also tolerate light shade, particularly in hotter climates.

Their upright, sculptural form makes them ideal for mass plantings, borders, or as a feature shrub.

Banksias are the essence of the Australian landscape. Their distinctive flower spikes, rich with nectar, bring a dynamic energy to the garden, attracting bees, butterflies and a chorus of honeyeaters.

With varieties ranging from ground-hugging prostrate forms to towering trees, there's a banksia for every space, whether you're creating a coastal retreat, a bush-style garden or a beautiful native feature.

These hardy plants thrive in well-drained, sandy or gravelly soils and love a sunny position.

While they can handle periods of dryness with ease, occasional deep watering in extended dry spells will encourage more prolific flowering.

Some species will also tolerate light shade, particularly in hotter climates, but for the best floral display, full sun is ideal.

Their varied foliage adds structure and movement to the garden, providing year-round interest even when not in bloom.

Banksias are as practical as they are beautiful. Their long-lasting flowers make a great addition to cut arrangements, while their ability to stabilise sandy soils makes them excellent for coastal planting.
